It has finally been confirmed that our Year 7 and 8 athletes were North Shropshire Junior Girls Athletics Champions! We stormed ahead to take the title with 246 points, over Moreton Hall in 2nd (174 points). Grace K won all 3 of her events – high jump, 70m Hurdles and long jump. Agatha won the Shot, Zoe won the Discus, Gabriella won the 800m, Genesis won the 100m and the relay team of Genesis, Rochelle, Juliet and Jess confidently led the way metres ahead of the other schools.

Every point counts in this, so we are grateful for such depth of talent in these year groups, and the resilience of those who got points but never want to run the 1500m again! Also important points were gathered from results by Rochelle who was 2nd in the 200m, Connie helped get us a 1st and 2nd finish in the 800m, Emma-Jayne 2nd and Juliet 4th in the 1500m, Grace S 6th in the long jump, Agatha achieving 3rd in high jump, Zoe coming 2nd in the shot (again another 1st and 2nd finish in this event), Jess 4th in discus and Jess and Layla coming 2nd and 5th respectively in the Javelin.

These are absolutely fantastic achievements that the girls should be very proud of.
