They did so well, that they won with a score of **92 out of 100**! They received a trophy and are through to the national finals which will be in the summer (*date to be confirmed*).

Creative packages used include Adobe Creative Suite, IBIS paint, and Sketch-up. A huge range and variety of creative outcomes - what talent we have!

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Our Year 12 students have had an excellent work experience, from Princess Royal Hospital, Telford Architects, Working Farms, Vets, Lawyers, Barclays Bank, Nursing homes and our very own media department! We have all been really impressed with how the girls have shown all attributes of our CLEAR programme and learnt new skills which will help towards their future careers and anchoring their UCAS applications and apprenticeships.
