Every year, the Adcote girls take part in the **Oswestry Music Festival**. This year, the girls amassed a whopping **70 entries** which included: **solo orchestral instruments, band instruments, classical, Musical Theatre and Pop singing, duets and choirs.**

Everyone performed their pieces with confidence and enjoyed hearing the feedback from the adjudicators.

Out of the 31 different categories entered, the girls collected 11 trophies for first places and placed in the top 3 in nearly every category which is an amazing achievement!

Poppets, Pops and Chamber Choir sounded wonderful and got lots of praise from the adjudicator and audience.

First places

- Rosina took the trophy in the 21 and Under Gilbert and Sullivan category.
- Mya placed 1st in the '15 and under Popular Music Singing', 18 and under Popular Music Singing' and '15 and under
 Musical Theatre' categories. The adjudicator asked if she was planning to be a singer as a career and was impressed by her
 technique.
- Seren topped the '13 and under set piece' category.
- Anna-Mae won the '9 and under' test piece song and was determined to win the '9 and under Musical Theatre' category. She sang her heart out and walked away with a well deserved first place.
- It was Gracie's first festival this year. She delivered a completely perfect performance and came home with first place.
- Alicia entered 7 classes this year, winning 4 trophies in the '11 and under set piece', '11 and under Musical Theatre' and '11 and under Own Choice piece' and finally the '13 and under own choice'.

Second places for the vocal categories went to Anna-Mae, Ava, Alicia and Ella.

Second places in the instrumental categories went to Alicia, Anna-Mae, Hay-Yee and Seren.

Third place in the vocal category went to Mya, Addie, Daisy, Jessica, Alicia, Anna-Mae, Ella, Seren and Lara. Third place in the instrumental category went to Odelia.





Hay-Yee joined the National Children's Orchestra of Great Britain (NCO) at their first of two Project Orchestra Weekends and played in the Cello Section. The event was held at Bolton School Boys Division.

The second Project Orchestra Weekend is planned for June.




Huge Congratulations go out to **Alicia** for her performance at the Winners Concert securing herself four trophies.

This week we launched **British Science Week at Adcote.** An annual tradition including getting the **Senior** students to stand up and talk about their future aspirations in **Science**. They are our best role models after all and did us proud.

This year's theme is "time", so we celebrated this year's achievement and Year 9 students did 5 demos in 5 minutes. This was brilliant fun and interactive and included audience participation, they all went to plan which was remarkable. The Year 9 demonstrators had only practiced them twice before the live show!

We also launched our two Science week challenges, open to the whole school. The first is to make an accurate 10 second timer using only a paper cup and water. The second is to create an Energy Town that will be sustainable into the future. There have already been some very high scores coming from Junior Prep, the teachers are going to have to up their game! It is remarkably addictive so apologies for the additional screen time requests from your daughters this week.















Our LAMDA Students are preparing for their LAMDA examinations in June.

Year 3 and 4 have been busy learning and preparing for their Stage III Introductory or Entry level (respectively) Speaking of Verse and Prose examinations. Whilst Year 5 girls are busy developing characterisations for their Group Acting piece taken from James and the Giant Peach.

Year 6 and Year 7 are honing their performances of two contrasting duologue scenes for their Grade 2 or **Grade 3 Acting** examinations.

Year 8 have reached the heady heights of Grade IV with their more 'angst ridden' Duologue or Solo **Acting** scenes. Alongside the younger students, senior students and sixth formers have their heads down preparing for Grade V, Grade VI, Grade VII and Grade VIII Speaking of Verse and Prose examinations the latter (from grade six upwards) carrying valuable UCAS points, contributing to their next steps into further education in line with the National Qualifications Framework. All examinations are due to be taken in the second week of June, so a hearty 'break a leg' to one and all!







50 students went to Birmingham Resorts Arena to take part in the Young Voices concert. The first half of the day was spent rehearsing the songs the girls have been learning in their music lessons and at breaktimes. This was followed by a concert where the girls got to experience singing with over **5,000 people** in the audience. The girls loved the street dancers Urban Strides and were blown away by 13 year old drummer, Nandi Bushell who was an inspiration, having already played with Lenny Kravtiz and the Foo **Fighters** to name a few!
